Re: California Proposition 65
Plaskolite Acrylic Sheet

In 1986, California voters approved an initiative to address their growing concerns about exposure to toxic chemicals. That initiative became the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, better known by its original name of Proposition 65.

Proposition 65 requires businesses to notify Californians about significant amounts of chemicals in the products they purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), which is part of the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA), administers the Proposition 65 program.

Based upon reviews of Plaskolite's raw materials and manufacturing processes, Plaskolite's acrylic sheets may contain up to 0.1% of Ethyl Acrylate (CAS 140-88-5), which is found on the California Proposition 65 list.

In addition to its low concentration in our acrylic sheets, this chemical is bound up within the matrix of the acrylic, and is not easily released. Finally, based on recent health studies that have shown Ethyl Acrylate to be essentially non-carcinogenic, we expect this chemical to be re-classified as a non-carcinogen in the future.
