Dear Aetna Plastics,

This letter is to address VYCOM'S Celtec[®] Expanded PVC sheet and Proposition 65. In 1986, California voters approved an initiative to address their growing concerns about exposure to toxic chemicals. That initiative became the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, better known by its original name of Proposition 65.

Proposition 65 requires businesses to notify Californians about significant amounts of chemicals in the products they purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), which is part of the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA), administers the Proposition 65 program.

We have not specifically analyzed this product for the purpose of identifying the presence of the substances listed in Proposition 65. However, we have tested our material per REACH, EC 1907/2006, Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemical substance. Our product is not manufactured or formulated above the 0.1% threshold, with any of the 169 Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) listed the candidate list that is current as of the effective date of June 20, 2016; <http://echa.europa.eu/web/guest/candidate-list-table>

We have also tested our material per RoHS; EU Directive 2011/65/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council. Our product is not intentionally manufactured or formulated with lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, Polybrominated biphenyl (PBB), and Polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE) above specified ppm limits, as identified in 2011/65/EU: Commission Decision of 8 June 2011 repealing Directive 2002/95/EC and its successive amendments

Lastly, we test our sheet material for phthalates per CPSC-CH-C1001-09.3 Standard Operating Procedure for Determination of Phthalates. VYCOM'S Celtec[®] Expanded PVC sheet contained less than 0.005% (w/w) which is well below the limit of 0.1% (w/w).

VYCOM has limited knowledge of your customers manufacturing processes, products or the circumstances under which potential exposures may arise; VYCOM is unable to certify that when our product is used to manufacture your customers' products, no individuals using such products in California will be exposed to any Proposition 65 chemicals in amounts that require a Proposition 65 warning. For this reason, your company must make its own determination that Vycom products are safe, lawful, and technically suitable for use in your company's intended applications.

VYCOM'S Celtec[®] Expanded PVC does not intentionally contain any carcinogens or reproductive toxins presently known by the State of California to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity at a level of exposure subject to the requirements of California Proposition 65.

The above information is presented in good faith and is believed to be accurate. Ultimate responsibility for determining the suitability for use in specific applications lies with the end product manufacturer.
